Power change in Iran to be best thing that could happen: Trump

President Donald Trump has said that a change in power in Iran "would be the best thing that could happen" as the US administration weighs whether to take military action against Tehran.

Trump made the comments shortly after visiting with troops in Ft Bragg, North Carolina, and after he confirmed earlier in the day that he's deploying a second aircraft carrier group to the Mideast for potential military action against Iran.

"It seems like that would be the best thing that could happen," Trump said in an exchange with reporters when asked about pressing for the ouster of the Islamic clerical rule in Iran. "For 47 years, they've been talking and talking."

Trump said earlier that the USS Gerald R Ford, the world's largest aircraft carrier, is being sent from the Caribbean Sea to the Mideast to join other warships and military assets the US has built up in the region. The planned deployment comes just days after Trump suggested another round of talks

with the Iranians was at hand. Those negotiations didn't materialise, as one of Tehran's top security officials visited Oman and Qatar this week and exchanged messages with US intermediaries. "In case we don't make a deal, we'll need it," Trump told reporters about the second carrier. He added, "It'll be leaving very soon."

Already, Gulf Arab nations have warned any attack could spiral into another regional conflict in a Middle East still reeling from the Israel-Hamas war in the Gaza Strip. Meanwhile, Iranians are beginning to hold 40-day mourning ceremonies for the thousands killed in Tehran's bloody crackdown on nationwide protests last month,

adding to the internal pressure faced by the sanctions-battered Islamic Republic. The Ford, whose new deployment was first reported by The New York Times, will join the USS Abraham Lincoln and its accompanying guided-missile destroyers, which have been in the region for over two weeks. US forces already have shot

down an Iranian drone that approached the Lincoln on the same day last week that Iran tried to stop a US-flagged ship in the Strait of Hormuz.

It is a quick turnaround for the Ford, which Trump sent from the Mediterranean Sea to the Caribbean last October as the administration built up a huge military presence in the lead-up to the surprise raid last month that captured then-Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro.

It also appears to be at odds with the Trump administration's national security and defence strategies, which put an emphasis on the Western Hemisphere over other parts of the world.

In response to questions about the movement of the Ford, US Southern Command said US forces in Latin America will continue to "counter illicit activities and malign actors in the Western Hemisphere".

"While force posture evolves, our operational capability does not," Col. Emanuel Ortiz, spokesman for Southern Command, said in a statement. US "forces remain fully ready to project power, defend themselves, and protect US interests in the region." (AP)

Canadian leaders pay tribute to school shooting victims

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney and the country's main opposition leader held hands Friday as they paid tribute to the victims of one of the worst mass shootings in the country's history at a vigil in a devastated British Columbia town.

Carney and Opposition Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre joined hands as an Indigenous leader sang a prayer outside the town hall in Tumbler Ridge.

Carney and Poilievre also spoke. The prime minister named each of the six people killed at Tumbler Ridge Secondary School and said the mother and brother of the shooter who were killed also "deserve to be mourned."

Authorities said the 18-year-old alleged shooter, identified as Jesse Van Rootselaar, killed her 39-year-old mother, Jennifer Jacobs, and 11-year-old stepbrother, Emmett Jacobs, in their home on Tuesday before heading to the nearby Tumbler Ridge Secondary School and opening fire, killing five children and an educator before killing herself.



Carney said he sat with people who are "living through something no one should ever have to endure." "When you wake up tomorrow, and the world feels impossible, know that millions of Canadians are with you. When the cameras leave and the quiet sets in - know that we will still be here," Carney said. A crowd of hundreds attended the vigil. Some held photos of loved ones they lost.

Carney said the community has always been defined by people caring for each other. "And when the unimaginable happened on Tuesday, you were there again. First responders arrived at the school within two minutes. Teachers shielding their children," he said.

Poilievre commended Carney for his "tremendous grace." Canada's political

leaders flew from Ottawa together.

British Columbia Premier David Eby said the students of the school won't ever have to return to the building if they don't want to. "I will promise that not one of you will ever be forced to go back to that school. We will provide a safe place for you to go back to school," Eby said.

Authorities on Thursday identified those killed at the school as Kylie Smith, Abel Mwansa, Zoey Benoit and Ticaria Lampert, all age 12, as well as 13-year-old Ezekiel Schofield and assistant teacher Shanna Avigan-Durand, 39.

Maya Gebala, 12, who was wounded in the head and neck, and Paige Hoekstra, 19, who also suffered bullet wounds, remain hospitalised in Vancouver. (AP)

Commonwealth Observer Group hails peaceful elections in Bangladesh

The Commonwealth Observer Group on Saturday commended the peaceful conduct of Bangladesh's parliamentary elections and the July Charter referendum, while highlighting areas where further progress on inclusion and accessibility could strengthen the democratic process.

The group's chairperson, former Ghana president Nana Akufo-Addo, noted that the polls on Thursday were held against the backdrop of significant political upheaval following the student uprising in July 2024. It led to the decision affecting the participation of some political parties, such as the Sheikh Hasina-led Awami League.

"The people of Bangladesh have exercised their democratic rights in pursuit of the fulfilment of their aspirations. We encourage them and united in their shared democratic future," said Akufo-Addo. In its interim report, the



Observer Group praised the vibrant media coverage, noting its important role in informing citizens and encouraging political debate. At the same time, it raised concerns about online misinformation, cyber harassment and hate speech, which continue to affect public discourse. The participation of women and youth emerged as areas requiring greater attention. Women accounted for only four per cent of candidates, with seven elected, while youth activism did not always translate into formal

influence within political party structures. According to the Commonwealth group's statement, despite isolated pre- and post-election tensions, polling officials, security personnel and election agents generally carried out their duties with professionalism. The group also noted that officials assisted elderly voters and persons with disabilities. However, many polling stations remained inaccessible, particularly on upper floors, and lacked provisions for other forms of disability.

On the referendum, the group said, "It recognises the Charter as a response to multiple and urgent demands for reform. At the same time, some stakeholders expressed concerns as to whether the referendum process was sufficiently consultative and clearly communicated."

The Commonwealth Observer Group has called on all stakeholders to maintain calm during the post-election period and consider the recommendations that will be outlined in a forthcoming report.

Tarique Rahman led the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), which emerged victorious with a majority of more than two-thirds in Parliament in this week's general election in Dhaka, during which voters also endorsed sweeping constitutional reform in a referendum held in parallel.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, among the world leaders who spoke to Rahman on Friday, congratulated him on a "remarkable victory." (PTI)

Bangladesh cabinet oath in next four days: Official

Bangladesh Prime Minister Mohammed Shahabuddin is expected to administer the oath of office to the new cabinet of BNP chairman Tarique Rahman within the next four days, officials said on Saturday.

Rahman's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) on Friday secured a sweeping victory with more than a two-thirds majority in the landmark parliamentary elections held on Thursday. The BNP leader is set to become the prime minister, replacing the interim Government chief Muhammad Yunus.

"In line with the Constitution, the president will administer the oath at Bangabhaban (presidential palace)," Cabinet Secretary Sheikh Abdul Rashid said without giving any specific date for the oath ceremony.

But a senior BNP policymaking leader, preferring anonymity, told PTI that the swearing-in ceremony is



expected to be held on February 16 or 17.

The Constitution requires the cabinet oath-taking ceremony to be followed by the swearing-in of new Parliament members, while a key aide to Rahman said the existing legal scenario made the issue a little complicated.

"The speaker of the last parliament is supposed to conduct the MPs' oath of office, but she resigned and is living in an undisclosed location. The deputy speaker is in jail,"

he said, wishing not to be named. In such circumstances, he said, the president might select someone to conduct the event of administering the lawmakers' oath, as "the Constitution has kept a provision" for such an eventuality.

The cabinet secretary, meanwhile, said the Constitution says the MPs-

elect must take an oath within three days of the gazette notification, and then the majority party would elect its parliamentary leader. The gazette notification was issued on Saturday morning.

Asked for the possible date of the cabinet's swearing-in, Rashid said no date was fixed yet.

"If we are instructed or indicated that it will be held on a certain date and at a certain time, we will work accordingly. Even if it is tomorrow, we will have to prepare for tomorrow. We will be able to tell you the date once we are informed," the top bureaucrat said.

Law ministry officials said, since the gazette notification was issued on Saturday, the three-day period for the oath-taking could be considered from Sunday, covering 15, 16 and 17 February.
